Been spraying for grubs which are prevalent on #2 and #7. Also spraying for goosegrass on all tees and random spots on fairways - application has been successful.

We have 6 live traps around the course and have caught 7 raccoons, 4 opossum and 1 cat which was released where it was caught. The other animals were relocated.

On October 11th, the course will be closed for aerating the greens.

The board passed the newer USGA rules to be used at our course which will be listed on the bulletin board. One example, if you hit out of bounds, instead of hitting over, you take it from where you went out to 2 club lengths in the fairway and laying 3 strokes.

Sports - Labor Day Tournament was a success, received good comments on how fun it was. Another Glo Ball Tournament is scheduled for October 2nd.

Buildings - The south deck and stairs were power washed and stained by Nolan, Laurizen, Steines, Schmidt and Parker. Our thanks to their work.

The door to the clubhouse from this deck had a crash bar installed for safety.
